Scripture Reading: Matthew 21:1-11, NKJV

Now when they drew near Jerusalem, and came to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, “Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Loose them and bring them to Me. And if anyone says anything to you, you shall say, ‘The Lord has need of them,’ and immediately he will send them.”

All this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying:

“Tell the daughter of Zion,
‘Behold, your King is coming to you,
Lowly, and sitting on a donkey,

THE GREAT DRAW

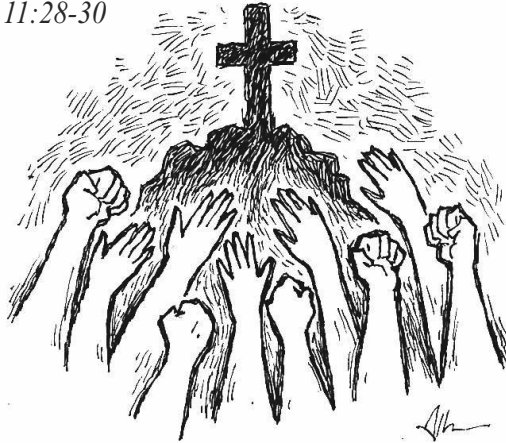
Theme: Palm Sunday set into motion the events by which Jesus draws all people to Himself. The words that Jesus spoke at the time of His entry into Jerusalem tells us that ...

1. BY THE CROSS, HE DRAWS ALL PEOPLES TO HIMSELF.

- a. **The cross is that upon which He was "lifted up"**
(see *John 3:13-15; 8:28*);
- b. **Not with the "if" of possibility, but of certainty**
(see *Revelation 13:28*);
- c. **By the pull of**
 - **The truth of our need** (*Romans 6:23*),
 - **The grace of the Father** (*John 3:16-17*),
 - **The love of Jesus for us** (*1 John 3:16*);
- d. **Through the work of the Father**
(see *John 6:37*).

2. BY HIS VICTORY, HE OVERCAME ALL OBSTACLES. (v. 31).
