This morning's message is taken from

Luke 12:1-3

THE TRUTH WILL COME OUT

Theme: There is dangerous potential in our words (James 3:5-8), and terrible accountability for them (Matthew 12:35-37). Knowing this, we must speak and live as people of truth today, because all falsehood will be exposed in the future. Jesus taught us this through giving us ...

1. A WARNING OF DANGER (v. 1).

"Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy."

(See Luke 11:39-52.)

2. A PRINCIPLE OF EXPOSURE (v. 2).

"For there is nothing covered that will not be revealed, nor hidden that will not be known."

(See Psalm 139:1-12; Hebrews 4:12-13; Revelation 20:12.)

3. A PROMISE REGARDING WORDS (v. 3).

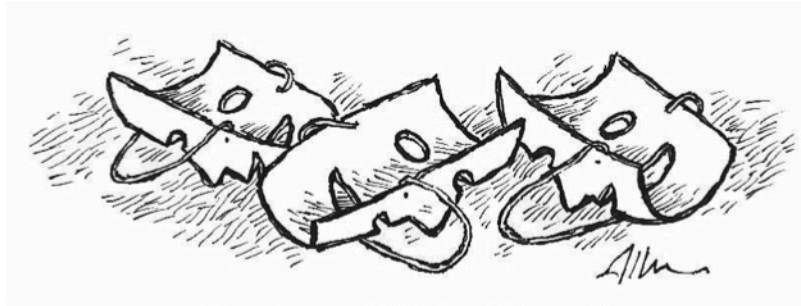
"Therefore whatever you have spoken in the dark will be heard in the light, and what you have spoken in the ear in inner rooms will be proclaimed on the housetops."

Conclusion:

-- Resist hypocrisy by seeking only God's approval (1 Corinthians 4:3-5).

-- Don't get drawn in by the hypocrisy of others (Psalm 141:3-4).

-- Set your lips and your speech aside for God (Ephesians 4:29-30).
