
October 25, 2020 This morning's message is part of our ongoing study of the New Testament book of 2 Corinthians; and is taken from 2 Corinthians 3:12-18

AN UNVEILED REFLECTION

Theme: All that we ever need finds its completion in Jesus (Colossians 1:28-29). And as Paul shows us in this passage, <u>those who gaze upon Christ</u> with an unveiled view become transformed into His image.

When it comes to the greater glory of the new covenant message of the gospel of Jesus (see vv. 7-11) ...

- 1. WE NOW SPEAK PLAINLY (vv. 12-13). (See 2 Corinthians 4:5-6.)
- 2. BUT A VEIL REMAINS (vv. 14-15). (See Romans 11:23-32.)
- 3. THIS VEIL IS REMOVED IN CHRIST (v. 16). (See Luke 24:19-32.)
- 4. AN UNVEILED GAZE TRANSFORMS (vv. 17-18).
