

This morning's message is part of our ongoing study of the New Testament book of 2 Corinthians; and is taken from 2 Corinthians 11:5-15

HUMBLING DOWN TO LIFT THE GOSPEL UP

This world exalts in power and success; and so it considers the message of the cross 'foolish' (1 Corinthians 1:18-31)—even though those who believe it are the true 'winners' (1 John 5:4). Paul's preaching of the gospel made him seem small in this world's eyes; but his conduct toward the Corinthians demonstrates to us that we should be willing to humble ourselves down so that the gospel can be lifted up high. His experience teaches us that ...

- WE MAY BE WORTHY OF HONOR AND RESPECT (vv. 5-6). (See 2 Corinthians 12:11-13.)
- BUT WE MUST BE WILLING TO BE HUMBLED IN THIS WORLD'S SIGHT (vv. 7-10). (See 1 Corinthians 4:9-13.)
- THIS IS SO THE TRUTH OF THE GOSPEL MAY BE LIFTED UP (vv. 11-15).
