
RESUME OF WEAKNESS

When it came to boasting--like the false teachers who were plaguing the Corinthian church were boasting--Paul would only boast of "the things which concern my infirmity" (2 Corinthians 11:30; see also 12:5-6, 9-10; 1 Corinthians 2:1-5).

If Paul wrote a ministry resume, it would highlight his weaknesses--so that Jesus may shine through. His example shows us that <u>it's our weakness</u> <u>through suffering--rather than our confidence in the flesh--that qualifies us</u> <u>the most in ministry</u>.

Paul shows us ...

- THE DANGER OF BOASTS IN THE FLESH (vv. 16-21a). (See 2 Corinthians 11:1-4.)
- THE REALITY OF SUFFERING FOR THE GOSPEL (vv. 21b-29). (See 1 Peter 2:21-25.)
- THE BOAST OF WEAKNESS UNDER CHRIST (vv. 30-33). (See Matthew 20:25-28).

But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. I want to know Christ—yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.
