THE LONGINGS OF THE WISE

If God were to offer to give you whatever you asked of Him, what would you ask? (See 1 Kings 3:9). The prayer of Agur--a humble man who sought to know truth from God; but who knew well his weaknesses (Jeremiah 10:23-24) --teaches us that a wise person longs for a life of integrity and sufficiency in order to bring glory to God.

In his prayer we learn lessons from ...

- THE EARNESTNESS OF HIS LONGING (v. 7). (See 1 John 5:14-15.)
- 2. THE NATURE OF HIS REQUESTS (v. 8).
 - For integrity of character. (See Proverbs 30:5-6; Ephesians 4:25.)
 - For sufficiency of circumstances. (See 1 Timothy 6:6-11.)
- THE MOTIVATION OF HIS HEART (v. 9). (See Philippians 4:10-13.)
