DON'T BE A CULPABLE CRITIC

Jesus taught us a very serious truth about our words: that we will give an account to God for them ((Matthew 12:36-37). And so, these wise words from Agur are important for us to hear. They teach us that we must be careful before God how we speak about the servant of someone else. Consider ...

1. WHAT IS BEING FORBIDDEN.

"Do not malign ..." (See James 3:6-10; Matthew 5:21-26.)

2. WHEN IT IS SPECIFICALLY BEING FORBIDDEN.

"a servant to his master ..." (See Exodus 22:28; Acts 23:1-5.)

3. WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF WE DO THIS WRONGLY.

a. In relation to the servant:

"Lest he curse you ..." (See Ecclesiastes 10:20.)

b. In relation to God:

"and you be found guilty." (See Romans 14:4.)

4. HOW THIS ESPECIALLY RELATES TO US AS BELIEVERS:

- a. Give up judging (James 4:11-12).
- b. Go direct (Matthew 18:15-17).
- c. Guard your heart (Ephesians 4:31-32).
