
March 27, 2022 This morning's message is taken from Proverbs 30:15-16

A LESSON FROM A LEECH

A leech is a loathsome creature--a parasite that, once attached to a body, takes and takes. It serves as an apt illustration of certain kinds of sinful cravings--the kind that, once we begin to gratify, only demand more and more.

The wise man Agur used this illustration to warn us that <u>certain sinful de-</u> sires, when gratified, lead us deeper and deeper into bondage.

- 1. SOME SINS ARE LEECH-LIKE IN THEIR DEMANDS (v. 15a). (See Genesis 4:6-7; John 8:34-36.)
- 2. SUCH SINS CANNOT SATISFY OUR LONGINGS (vv. 15b-16).
 - -- Greed is as insatiable as the grave. (See Proverbs 27:20; Habakkuk 2:5.)
 - -- Envy is as hollow as barrenness. (See Genesis 30:1; but also 1 Samuel 1:10-11.)
 - -- Self-indulgence leaves one as dry as the desert. (See Ecclesiastes 1:7; 2:3-11.)
 - -- Lust is as consuming as fire. (See Proverbs 6:26-27; Romans 1:27; 1 Corinthians 7:9.)
- 3. THE GREATEST DEFENSE AGAINST SUCH SINS IS A CLOSE RELATIONSHIP WITH JESUS. (See John 4:13-14; Matthew 11:28-30.)
