A GRACIOUS CONCLUSION

In Ephesians 6:23-24, the apostle Paul offered these final words to his readers. It may seem, at first, like a simple greeting—common in many of his letters. But upon closer examination, we see that Paul's farewell words reinforce to us all of the glorious spiritual blessings that are now ours in Christ.

1. **WHAT ARE THE SPIRITUAL BLESSINGS HE AFFIRMS?**
 - a. Peace (2:11-17; 4:1-6; 6:15.)
 - b. Love (2:1-7; 5:25-29; 4:13-16.)
 - c. Faith (2:8-9; 1:15-23; 3:14-21.)
 - d. Grace (1:6; 4:7-8.)
2. **FROM WHOM DO THESE BLESSINGS COME?**
 - a. From God our Father
 - b. Through Jesus our Lord
3. **TO WHOM DO THESE BLESSINGS BELONG?**
 - a. The brethren
 - b. Who love our Lord Jesus
 - c. Sincerely
