September 29, 2024 This morning's message is part of our ongoing study of the Old Testament Book of Daniel; and is taken from Daniel 11:36-45

THE FINAL TYRANT

In Daniel 11:2-35, an angel gave Daniel a prophetic vision of future events that—from our perspective today—have all been confirmed in ancient history. But in verses 36-45, he's given a description of the activities of a king that is yet to come in what is called "the time of the end" (vv. 35, 40). This king is called "the little horn" in Daniel 7:8 and verses 24-27, "the prince who is to come" in 9:26-27, "the man of sin" in 2 Thessalonians 2:3, "the Antichrist' in 1 John 2:18, and "the beast" in Revelation 13:1, and 5-8; 17:8-14; and 19:20.

This man will be the world's last and most vicious tyrant. But as the Bible shows us, God remains in control. This passage assures us that <u>even the most</u> troublesome tyrant in history can do no more than what God has decreed to be done.

We see this in what was revealed to Daniel concerning this coming prince:

1. HIS CHARACTER (vv. 36-39).

(See Isaiah 14:12-15; 2 Thessalonians 2:4; Revelation 6:1-2.)

- 2. HIS CONQUESTS (vv. 40-43). (See Daniel 9:27; 12:1; Matthew 24:15-22.)
- 3. HIS CONCLUSION (vv. 44-45). (See 2 Thessalonians 2:8.)

Conclusion: 2 Thessalonians 2:13-17
