HOW NOT TO SUFFER SHIPWRECK

Many professing Christians who had begun strong in their commitment to faith in the gospel of Jesus didn't end up faithful to it. Somehow along the way, they ended up bringing dishonor to—or even speaking against—the faith they once professed. As the apostle Paul put it, they suffered 'shipwreck'. And in the end, it was often because they didn't preserve *both* 'faith' *and* a 'good conscience' together. We can't live without both; because an ongoing disregard to the call of conscience will eventually lead to compromises in believing.

The conscience is a provision from God that warns us against doing wrong and compels us to do right (see Romans 2:13-16; 1 Timothy 4:1-2; Titus 1:15-16; Hebrews 10:22). Ignoring it is like neglecting the rudder of a ship. Paul's warning to Timothy teaches us that we must keep a good conscience in our commitment to the faith, lest we suffer shipwreck in our walk with Jesus.

Notice ..

- 1. THE <u>COMMAND</u> TO PROTECT THE GOSPEL (v. 18). (See 1 Timothy 1:3-4; 4:14; 2 Timothy 1:6-7; Jude 3.)
- 2. THE <u>WARNING</u> TO ALSO KEEP A GOOD CONSCIENCE (v. 19a.) (See 2 Corinthians 11:25; Acts 27.)
- 3. THE <u>DANGER</u> OF LOSS IF WE FAIL TO DO BOTH (vv. 19b-20). (See 2 Timothy 2:17-18; Matthew 18:15-20; 1 Corinthians 5:4-5.)



Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 1:17-21 (nkjv)

And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear; knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot. He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God.
