This morning's message is part of our ongoing study from the New Testament epistle of 1 Timothy, and is taken from 1 Timothy 3:8-13


'LIKEWISE DEACONS'

Deacons (which comes from the Greek word for 'one who renders service') is one of the only two official 'offices' described in the New Testament for the church. The Bible tells us very little about 'deacons'; but it is clearly an official office (Philippians 1:1). The origin of this role in the church seems to come from Acts 6:1-7 and the 'seven' selected to serve the church so the apostles could concentrate on prayer and the word.

As Paul's words show us—just as was true of 'overseers'—the church's ministry of 'deacon' is a holy calling that requires holy qualifications in terms of ...

- 1. CHARACTER OF LIFE (vv. 8, 11).
- 2. COMMITMENT TO DOCTRINE (v. 9).
- **EXPERIENCE OF SERVICE (v. 10).**
- MANAGEMENT OF FAMILY (v. 12)
- 5. MOTIVATION FOR CHRIST (v. 13).

Conclusion: 1 Peter 4:7-11
